CONNECT WITH ENGAGE


Have you tried ENGAGE? This easy-to-use, mobile-optimized system allows you to give securely online, set up auto draft giving and view your giving history at your convenience.

Engage goes beyond online giving to also provide you a way to connect with others in the region through common interest groups, update contact information and register for regional and district events.

To get started, go to www.kansasdisciples.org/give and click the Engage portal button. From there, follow the on screen instructions to create an account or log into your existing account.

If creating a new account, you will receive an email to reset your password and confirm the creation of your account. Mobile users will be prompted to add engage.suran.com as a shortcut app.

After account creation, you can update your information, manage regional and district giving, and register for events all from one login.

THE NCM SEARCH CONTINUES

The search for the new Regional Minister of New Church Ministry continues.



The New Church Ministry team met in early January to review applications from 12 candidates. The first round of Zoom interviews with six of those candidates will be in a few weeks.

We understand that our existing models of church meet the needs of those already connected but want to empower those feeling a call to share God’s Grace in broader circles.

This partnership is a three year appointment was approved by the regional board in April 2020. NEWS FROM THE GENERAL CHURCH

TIME AND DATE CHANGED FOR 2023 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

In a special called virtual meeting in December 2020, the General Board of the Christian Church (DOC) voted on behalf of the General Assembly to change the time and place of the 2023 General Assembly. In 2023, the General Assembly will meet in Louisville, Kentucky, from July 29 to August 1.

In 2019, the invitation was extended by the Christian Church in Kentucky and approved by the General Assembly to hold the 2021 General Assembly in Louisville. Also in 2019, the invitation was extended by the Christian Church in Tennessee to hold the 2023 General Assembly in Memphis, Tenn.

In the late spring of 2020, the moderator team of the General Assembly, the General Minister and

President, and the staff of the Office of General Minister and President (OGMP) began discussion of whether the 2021 General Assembly could be held due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. On July 19, 2020, at a special called meeting of the General Board, the 2021 General Assembly was cancelled.

Later that fall, Louisville's team approached the OGMP with a proposal to hold the 2023 General Assembly in Louisville from Saturday, July 29, to Tuesday, August 1, 2023, with the understanding that the deposit paid for 2021 be applied to 2023, and that all 2021 cancellation fees will be waived. After careful review of many options, the moderator team determined that

to be good stewards of the church's resources, the best course of action would be to move the 2023 Assembly from Memphis to Louisville.

"I am grateful for the region's flexibility and graciousness in making this change," said Rev. Terri Hord Owens, general minister and president. "I want Memphis to be at the top of our list as we plan future gatherings."

No decision has yet been made regarding the time or place for any assemblies beyond 2023.

"After this difficult time apart," said moderator Belva Brown Jordan, "it will be good to gather in Louisville in 2023 to worship together and do the work of the Church."

REMEMBER TO SUBMIT YOUR CHURCH YEARBOOK REPORT

From January through March 15, you will be able to enter all your Yearbook data using the new ALEX: Data for Disciples system. While there your church can also capture your weekly attendance and giving data to see trends.

It is hoped that the Alex database will enable us to more effectively connect congregations with new ideas and those who have similar interests, as well as indicate the places where general or regional ministries might be able to assist.

The submitted information will be forwarded to the regional office for approval before going on to the yearbook database. If the regional staff has any questions, they will be contacting you.

The Yearbook & Directory of the Christian Church is a snapshot in time of our church, collectively—taking inventory of our ministries, resources, and overall health, providing information to one another and to the church at large for our

mutual ministry. It is only complete if every congregation and ministry reports accurate information.

Each congregation which is listed is covered under our church-wide 501(c)3 designation, and a copy of the completed Yearbook & Directory is provided to the IRS in lieu of each listed congregation filling out quarterly reports.
