BUILDING YOUR CHURCH COMMUNICATIONS TEAM

Church communications is more than just editing the newsletter. Church communication is a complex and ever-changing concept and it requires more than one person to make it effective. Staff can't do everything. That is where your communications team comes in.

Why should we have a communications team?

It takes a dedicated communications team to organize your church's various communications messages intentionally and strategically. Whether you're building your church communications team or you already have one, all of these skills are valuable. With your unique combination, you can grow your ministry and your church, and reach out to the world to show what your community is really like.

Who should be on the communications team?

One of the best ways to plan for additional growth in your communications efforts is to ask yourself who you need to add to the communications team. Every team will look different and might include paid staff, volunteers, freelancers, interns, or some combination thereof.

If your church is fortunate enough to have staff, make sure you don't lock out volunteers. You might have people who can contribute in different ways. Whether you're recruiting staff or volunteers, intentionality is still important. Your team should consist of 4-6 people from a variety of backgrounds, ages, and genders that could fulfill one of the suggested roles below. While one individual may be able to take on all of these roles, your communications team needs all of these skills to thrive.

<u>Project manager</u>—Coordinates between ministry leaders, creative staff, vendors, and volunteers.

<u>Brand manager</u>—They are responsible for checking that each publication matches your church's brand and style.

<u>Copywriter</u> – An excellent writer who understands the power of experience and personal stories.

<u>Graphic designer</u>—Creates compelling graphics to support the messages and promotions of the church.

Social media guru— Coordinates social media promotions and manages social media platforms.

<u>Photographer/Videographer</u>—Someone who understands how to tell a story visually. Fortunately, you don't need professional studio equipment.

<u>Cheerleader</u>—An outgoing, polished speaker who will make your announcements and bring excitement.

<u>The Outsider</u>—Helps remove "church-speak" and looks at everything from an outsider, visitor, or non-Christian perspective.

<u>The Listener</u> — Understands how important listening is and usually has the "magic" touch for recruiting volunteers.

Final Recommendation

Start simple, start somewhere and work with what you have. These skill sets are a hypothetical dream team—the pinnacle of communications. It's ok if it takes you some time to get there.

FCC WELLINGTON SUPPORTS BLANKET SUNDAY



The DWF of FCC Wellington reported a donation of \$1140 in their participation in the Church World Service 2022 Blanket Sunday event.

Their offering, along with others around the world, provided 51,810 fleece blankets, 16,950 heavy blankets, 83,760 hygiene kits, 33,240 school kits and 4,642 cleanup buckets.

More than \$2.5 million in goods were shipped to various parts of the world suffering from disasters through this event.

When difficult times happen, a kind and loving response can make all the difference. That's why the CWS Blankets program was created—to give a kind, loving and tangible response to someone facing a difficult time,

reminding them that they are not alone.

WSCC is hosting the pumpkin patch in partnership with Midtown Community Services, Potwin Presbyterian Church, and Topeka Center for Peace and Justice.


The theme for the spring event is, "Living your Faith." Gail Goolsby, a resident of South-Central Kansas, is the keynote





Disciples Church Extension Fund (DCEF), a general ministry of the CC (DoC) offers building planning, loans, and capital campaign guidance to Disciples congregations.

They provide up to \$150,000 to faith communities that want to upgrade their air conditioning, repair or replace inefficient windows, and/or insulate, rewire, or weatherproof a facility.


