The annual Christmas Offering supports regional ministries in 31 regions across the United States and Canada. Through this offering ministers are nurtured, and congregations are provided opportunities for work and worship.

The 2022 Christmas Offering will be received on Dec. 11 and 18.

Kansas Disciples are growing into a new vision! Throughout the region, significant efforts are being made to nurture and support those who are following a call to congregational ministry. Monthly clergy meetings and an annual retreat are two of the ways in which this happens each year.

We are working together to combat systematic racism and promote reconciliation. Through a grant from the Kansas Bible Chair (KBC), we are developing training in anti-racism/pro-reconciliation missions.



We are moving forward with plans to establish a regional ministry position for New Church Ministries. In doing so, we are prioritizing new church plantings, growth, and missions.

Church leaders continue to have opportunities for spiritual growth and leadership training. These include boundaries training, workshops, retreats, and webinars on various subjects. These trainings featured Kansas leaders and General Church representatives. A partnership grant

from the Kansas Leadership Center and a KBC grant allowed church leaders to attend leadership training sessions.

The region's summer camping program encourages our future church leaders and establishes friendships that go beyond their time at camp. Youth retreats, mission trips, and camps build on faith as participants live out what they have been taught.

Regional communications ministries continue to evolve as we connect Disciples across Kansas. The *Kansas Messenger* is provided monthly. The regional website, camp website, and social media pages are updated.





Disciples Women programs continue to provide leadership growth and fellowship opportunities through events such as Spirit Fest and fall retreats. We continue to strengthen Disciples Men programs to equip and empower men for ministry in their congregations, in the region, and beyond.

There are many opportunities for connecting and equipping our Kansas Region. The 2022 Christmas Offering is an opportunity for you to invest in these ministries. All funds from this offering remain in Kansas and support the regional ministry.


This season in the life of the Church is not a passive time! It is a time to prepare, get ready, and help others see Jesus! So, I

A LONGEST NIGHT SERVICE

Loss is a natural part of life. There are many things we grieve and mourn – loss of a loved one, loss of a job or financial stability, loss of health, of peace, of a marriage or other relationship, of a dream...and so much more.

These may lead to feelings of emptiness, anger, guilt, withdrawal from others, difficulty focusing, questions about faith or spirituality, or even physical responses. There is no "set" or "proper" way to grieve and grief comes in many forms.

A Longest Night Service will be held at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 21, at Augusta First Christian Church, 1600 State Street. This is the Winter Solstice, the shortest day and longest night of the year. At this time of the year when people are joyfully preparing for Christmas with family gatherings, presents, songs, and light displays, people who are in grief may feel even more lost and out of place.

This service is designed to let people know that it's okay to grieve a loss and to offer them a safe place to be themselves. It will include prayers, songs, readings, a short meditation, and the opportunity to pray with elders of the church. We urge you to invite any friends that might benefit from attending. No need to RSVP.

TIME TO GATHER YOUR YEARBOOK DATA—ALEX DATABASE REPORTS DUE FEB 28



The ALEX Yearbook reporting period for 2022 data will open on Sunday, Jan. 15. Church reports are due to your regional Business Office electronically by Tuesday, Feb. 28.

Information in ALEX will not be sold or shared with third party vendors. ALEX is an exclusive application built only for Disciples congregations, regions, and general ministries to use. Congregation statistics in ALEX, like the white pages in the printed Yearbook, are available to individuals, congregations, ministers, regions, and general ministries that purchase a subscription for online access.

A worksheet is available as you gather your 2022 information for the report. This year's worksheet significantly reduces the amount of data requested to make reporting less cumbersome and improve response rate.

Each congregation should have one user with the role of Congregational Reporter. An ALEX user with this role must submit the annual ALEX Yearbook Report electronically. Paper worksheets will not be accepted. Regional staff cannot enter church data.

If you are the Congregational Reporter, you can update your congregation's information by logging into ALEX and going to the Yearbook (ribbon icon) section. Click the *Edit Entry* button. To save and submit your changes, go to the *Submit* tab, enter your name, and click the *Submit* button.

She was trained as a vocalist and early in her career she taught art in schools. Her love of the arts led her to do extensive training in the use of Arts in Spirituality, which she used well in helping churches develop a vision for their ministry as well as in promoting spiritual development.
