The Regional Disciples Connect & Equip event will be Saturday, Aug. 12, at First Christian Church McPherson, 101 S. Walnut. This year's theme will center around "Sustaining Our Movement for Wholeness: Reclaiming Our Identity as Disciples of Christ".

Registration is open at *www.kansasdisciples.org/dce* through Friday, Aug. 4. Registrations after Aug. 4 will be accepted by phone.

A full day of activities are planned with presentations from the Kansas Leadership Center (KLC), Keynote Speaker Pastor Josh Leu, Great Bend FCC, and afternoon workshops on The Church Narrative Project with Tom Stanley, The Covenant Project with Etienna Mertel, Clearwater FCC, and a KLC Leadership training Discussion with Dale Matherly, Topeka FCC. The workshops will focus on of what it means to be a movement for wholeness in terms of physical, spiritual, and relational well-being, with practical next steps and resources to take to congregations.

First Christian Church, Manhattan Hosted By: The Tri-Regional Partnership Initiative Friday, Sept. 29-Saturday, Sept. 30

Have you ever experienced a process that shifted your world? What would it look like for members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to hear storytellers and engage our narratives? And what kind of church might we have if we imagined a narrative of a shared future?

It's about imagining a future by being honest about the stories that make us who we are as a church, and deciding together which stories to carry forward and which may not serve our shared future. During Story Hour we'll tell stories of seeing the light, epiphanies, large and small to deliver – "Eureka!", "Ah-ha!", "I've got it!", or "I finally understand!" insights. Almost all of us have had some moment of revelation. When we can see ourselves, or some relationship, or the world with greater clarity. Storytellers in each region will tell true 7-minute stories of a time when the scales fell from their eyes — or they told someone *else* the truth ("we need to call that doctor *now*"). An exchange that changed their sense of yourself from then on ("You *do* belong here; this is where God wants you"). A connection with someone unexpected that changed your path. (Any Damascus Road moments?).

So, come hear true stories, share dinner with Disciples from across the Tri-Regional Partnership Initiative



(Greater Kansas City, Kansas, and Nebraska), and help shape the future in which God is calling the region and the whole church through the Transformative Community Conferencing process, a practical, faithful, non-divisive model.

GOD DOESN'T NEED OUR MONEY

It is all about your heart ... everything we have is a gift from God and in return we should respond with gratitude.

What is the most awkward gift giving experience you've ever had or seen? Maybe you or someone you know got busted regifting, or the gift wasn't something the person wanted at all.

When it comes to giving gifts, the point is not the gift itself. The point is the heart of the giver.

In Genesis 4, we meet two brothers, Cain and Abel. Cain begrudgingly gave the leftovers from his harvest, but Abel gave the most valuable animals of his flock. Abel's gift came from a love and desire to please God. Cain's did not.

God gave Cain a chance to change his heart and warned him of the sin waiting to overcome him, but instead, Cain grew angry and allowed jealousy to consume him. Cain murdered Abel, which condemned him from God's presence.

Giving is a heart issue. God doesn't want us to give to Him so we can check off a task. He also doesn't want us to give less than our best. God wants us to give from a faithful heart that desires to please Him. God doesn't need our gift; He wants our hearts.

Think about:

- Are you giving to a local church? Why or why not?
- Are you or your church giving to the regional or wider church?
 - Why or why not
- What is your motivation for giving?
- Do your reasons for giving reflect a heart that loves God? If yes, how so? If not, what needs to change?
